

Floods Update 12 May 2010

The following is an update on the floods situation in Afghanistan since OCHA's last update on 9 May:

GoA briefing:

On 11 May, Vice President Khalili chaired a briefing at ANDMA, where he stated that almost 20 provinces have been hit by flooding, 8 of them severely; 120 people have died; and 10,000 homes have been damaged or destroyed. In addition to human casualties, damage to infrastructure and livelihoods has been high. Road clearance, rehabilitation of agricultural land, and air access were identified as priorities. In addition to dispatching teams to the affected areas to assess needs and provide compensation, the government has allocated 3 million Afs to each flood-affected province as well as 2 million Afs each to all other provinces for preparedness. As of 11 May, WFP reported that they were providing food assistance to 5,800 flood-affected families and that assessment reports continue to be received.

Assessment findings have been shared at the regional level and OCHA has requested humanitarian agencies in the regions to provide updated information on their relief stocks and contributions to the humanitarian response.

Central Highlands:

Bamyan province:

Further to the assessment data included in the 9 May flood update, a team including representatives from ANDMA, OCHA, DRRD, ARCS, and Helvetas has identified 884 flood-affected families needing humanitarian assistance in the affected districts (Bamyan center, Kahmard, Panjab, Waras, Saighan, Yakawlang, and Shiber). IOM, UNICEF, UNHCR, ARCS, and DRRD have allocated NFIs and WFP has been requested to provide food assistance.

Dai Kundi province:

No assessment data has been received from Dai Kundi to date.

Central region:

On 10 May, the following reports of flooding were received:

- <u>Logar province</u>: The PDMC reports flooding in Khoshi and Mohammad Agha districts; an assessment team has been dispatched.
- <u>Wardak province</u>: The PDMC reports that two people were injured and crops of 267 families destroyed by floods in Chak, Nirh, and Behood districts. The PRT has provided food, clothing, and blankets to the PDMC.
- <u>Parwan province</u>: The PDMC reports a total of 35 houses, 1,000 jeribs of agricultural land, and roads and canals damaged in Sayiagard, Shiakhali, Surkhparsa, and Shinwari districts. ARCS and DoRRD will assist the affected families and DoPW will open the roads.
- <u>Panjshir province</u>: The PDMC reports 79 families affected by floods in Dara district, 11 in Rukha district, and 13 in Barzak district.

Eastern region:

- An inter-agency assessment conducted in zone 1 of Jalalabad city after flooding on 6 May reported 10 houses completely destroyed and 21 partially damaged. WFP and IOM are mobilizing the necessary food and NFIs for the affected families and there are no gaps reported.
- Flooding is also reported to have destroyed some crops in Kunar province; the HRT is investigating further.

Civil-military coordination:

On 10 May, OCHA met with ANDMA and ISAF to discuss the flood response. It was agreed that the government has the lead in the flood response; that requests for assistance should be channelled through PDMCs; that requests for assistance from ISAF should be channelled through ANDMA Kabul and that MOD/ANA resources would be used before ISAF resources whenever possible (ISAF agreed to inform RCs of this procedure); that there would be full information-sharing with ANDMA and partners; and that at a later time there will be a meeting at ANDMA to discuss lessons learned and capacity building for ANDMA and NEOC.
