Organizational Context & Project Description

This position is based in the UNAMA Peace & Reconciliation Office (PRO), led by the Special Advisor to

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the SRSG on Peace & Reconciliation. PRO focuses on UNAMA's support to the Afghan peace efforts, including through Local Peace Initiatives and regional engagements. The international and national political affairs officers in PRO are supported by and work closely with dedicated peace and reconciliation officers in seven key UNAMA Field Offices, who are charged primarily with supporting Field Office efforts to implement peace initiatives and conduct consensus-building activities at the local level. The UN Volunteer would work closely with her counterparts in the Peace & Reconciliation Office in the UNAMA HQ and in the Field Offices, as well as with other relevant UNAMA sections, such as the Gender Affairs Office and the Human Rights Service.

Sustainable Development Goals 16. Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions Task description

Under the direct supervision of Senior Political Affairs Officer, Peace & Reconciliation Office, the National Youth UN Volunteer will undertake the following tasks:

- Support the development of PRO's work on Women, Peace and Security and women's and youth participation in peace processes.
- Help advance the PRO's engagements with non-governmental and civil society organisations working on peace and reconciliation.
- Establish collaborative working relations with counterparts throughout the UNAMA HQ substantive sections and the UNAMA Field Offices, particularly those working on women and youth engagement.
- Assist the Peace & Reconciliation Office in any other areas of work, as requested.

Furthermore, UN Volunteers are required to:- Strengthen their knowledge and understanding of the concept of volunteerism by reading relevant UNV and external publications and take active part in UNV activities (for instance in events that mark International Volunteer Day)- Be acquainted with and build on traditional and/or local forms of volunteerism in the host country- Provide annual and end of assignment reports on UN Volunteer actions, results and opportunities using UNV's Volunteer Reporting Application-Contribute articles/write-ups on field experiences and submit them for UNV publications/websites, newsletters, press releases, etc.- Assist with the UNV Buddy Programme for newly-arrived UN Volunteers-Promote or advise local groups in the use of online volunteering, or encourage relevant local individuals and organizations to use the UNV Online Volunteering service whenever technically possible.

- Structured guidance, mentoring and coaching by a supervisor including a clear workplan and performance appraisal;
- Access to office space, equipment, IT support and any other systems and tools required to complete the objectives of the assignment including a host entity email address;
- Access to shared host entity corporate knowledge, training and learning;
- Inclusion of the volunteer in emergency procedures such as evacuations;
- Leave management;
- DSA for official travel, when applicable;
