Letter of Agreement among nine ministries dated 25 August 2013

THE LETTER OF AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

MMINISTRY OF WOMEN'S AFFAIRS

NATIONAL DIRECTORATE OF SECURITY

The Ministry of Interior (MoI), the Ministry of Labor, Social Affairs, Disabled and Martyrs (MoLSAMD), the Office of the Attorney General (AGO), the Ministry of Justice (MoJ),the Supreme Court, the Ministry of Public Health (MoPH), the Ministry of Women's Affairs (MoWA), and the National Directorate of Security (NDS) hereby agree to support action to pilot "Referrals and Cooperation between Social Workers, Police Officers, Prosecutors, and Judges" at province and district level in line with the requirements as stipulated in the Juvenile Code.

COAL

The overall goal of the partnership is to contribute to a child-oriented and right-based juvenile justice system that respects children's rights and best interests; prioritises their rehabilitation and reintegration based on the individual child's needs and circumstances; and ensures that detention and custodial sentences are used only as a last resort and for the shortest period of time.

OBJECTIVES:

Specific objectives of the partnerships are:

- 1) To facilitate implementation of Article 2, 8, 11, 17, 20, 33, 34 and 35 of the Juvenile Code stipulating the critical role of social workers in complementing the work of police and prosecution at the stage of arrest and investigation of a case;
- 2) To develop an official mechanism to ensure the implementation of "social inquiry reports" (i.e. the "Beijing Rules" Rule 16, Juvenile Code Article 17) for children coming into conflict with the law by establishing a referral system between local social workers and Police in charge of juvenile matters.

AMENDMENT:

For any amendment of the Letter of Agreement (LoA), prior written agreement among thenine parties will be mandatory.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Specific responsibilities of each party are described below.

MINISTRY OF LABOUR, SOCIAL AFFAIRS, DISABLED AND MATYRS (MoLSAMD)

MoLSAMD, as the lead agency of provincial Child Protection Action Networks (CPAN)1, shall:

- 1. Appoint a senior level official authorised to represent MoLSAMD in the LoA National Working Group.
- 2. Instruct DoLSAMD directors to provide the required support to implement the LoA at provincial level.
- 3. Ensure that there are enough trained and accredited social workers in provinces to meet the needs of children in contact with the law. Ensure that social workers are both male and female and that there is a clear job description in place for each social worker.
- 4. Provide the necessary logistical and financial resources to social workers to enable them to undertake their responsibilities to complete the *social inquiry report* individual care and reintegration plans.

¹ In line with the National Strategy for Children at Risk (NSFCAR), MoLSAMD, with support of UNICEF, initiated the establishment of Child Protection Action Networks (CPANs) in 2007, mandated to prevent and respond to child protection violations at provincial level. Chaired by DoLSAMD, CPANs are comprised of representatives of both governmental and non-governmental organizations. As of 2009, there are 28 provincial CPANs, and 32 district CPANs.

- Ensure that the staff person responsible for CPAN at DoLSAMD, in consultation with CPAN members, prepares and submits a list of trained social workers locally available in the respective province (Social Worker Contact Sheet) to provincial police headquarters and to district police stations where there is a CPAN liaison officer and ensure that it is regularly updated and any changes promptly communicated to provincial police headquarters;
- 6. Ensure that trained social workers², listed on the provincial *Social Worker Contact Sheet*, promptly act upon requests by the police and prepare *social inquiry reports* in line with agreed timescales (ideally within 7 days following the child's arrest).
- 7. Ensure that CPAN closely monitors the use and effectiveness of social inquiry reports in the respective province by collecting data on their implementation and reports to central MoLSAMD offices in their monthly monitoring reports as well as to the LoA National Working Group.
- 8. Conduct periodic reviews of the forms currently used for social inquiry reports and propose any necessary changes to the signatories of this Letter of Agreement;
- Assign social workers to work alongside police of the Juvenile Justice Units of the Criminal Investigation Units at provincial police headquarters to provide support in the assessment of cases and ensure prompt completion of social inquiry reports when required;
- 10. Lead on policy advocacy to institutionalize "Referrals between Social Workers, Police Officers and Prosecutors", particularly by using the experiences and lessons learnt documented by provincial CPANs.
- 11. Provide suitable shelter accommodation and psychological support to children after release from JRCs in cases where children's families or guardians are unknown or families or guardians refuse to receive their children.

MINISTRY OF INTERIOR (Mol)

The Ministry of Interior (Mol) shali:

- 1. Appoint a senior level official authorised to represent Mol in the LoA National Working Group.
- 2. Instruct Mol provincial Police Commanders and Juvenile Police Units to provide the required support in implementing the ŁoA at provincial level.
- 3. Ensure both male and female Juvenile Police trained in child rights are present in all provinces and that there is a clear job description in place for each juvenile police officer.
- 4. Ensure that the Juvenile Police disseminate the messages of child rights to their colleagues and report any child rights abuses to the Mol Police Ombudsperson.

² Or where not available care workers

- 5. Appoint CPAN liaison police officers in the police headquarters and district police stations (particularly those of highly populated districts) of all provinces with CPAN presence:
- 6. Ensure timely compilation and submission of the list of *CPAN liaison police* officers to the respective provincial CPANs. This list needs to be regularly updated and any changes promptly communicated to the provincial CPAN;
- 7. Ensure prompt dissemination of the Social Worker Contact Sheet from provincial police headquarters to all CPAN liason police officers at district police stations;
- 8. Ensure that Police inform the family, guardians or appropriate adult of the child within 24 hours of arrest and ensure that the family, guardians or appropriate adult are present during all interrogations of the child.
- 9. Instruct district police to immediately request the support of a trained social worker listed in the provincial Social Worker Contact Sheet when responding to cases involving children:
- 10. In those provinces where there are Juvenile Justice Units of the Criminal Investigation Departments (CID) ensure close cooperation of police with social workers assigned to them;
- 11. Ensure submission of social inquiry reports prepared by trained social workers listed in the provincial Social Worker Contact Sheet to the relevant prosecutor's office for their consideration within 14 days;
- 12. Ensure *CPAN liaison police* officers are trained in I child protection and attend monthly district and provincial CPAN meetings in the respective province;
- 13. Regularly and systematically compile statistics of the arrest of children and outcomes, together with the police response to cases involving children in contact with the law on a monthly basis to the LoA National Working Group
- 14. Implement a policy on diversion for children who have committed a first time offence and/or in obscenity or misdemeanor cases as defined in the Juvenile Code 2005. .
- 15. Ensure that age determination is carried out by the Ministry for Public Health on the recommendations of the Social Worker who has completed the social inquiry report.
- 16. Support police, prosecutors and Judges by undertaking timely and impartial age verification of children referred to the newly established DNA test center at center and zone levels.

THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE (AGO)

The Attorney General's Office (AGO) shall:

- 1 Appoint a senior level official authorised to represent AGO in the LoA National Working Group.
- 2. Instruct AGO provincial directors to provide the required support in implementing the LoA at provincial level.
- 3. Ensure that all prosecutors are trained in child rights in general and the Juvenile Code 2005 in particular.
- 4. Ensure that there are enough trained juvenile prosecutors in the provinces to meet the needs of children in contact with the law and ensure that these juvenile prosecutors receive juvenile cases from only the district prosecution units and refer to the Juvenile Court if necessary.
- 5. Ensure that district/provincial prosecutors receive social inquiry reports on all children's cases from a trained social worker listed in the provincial "Social Worker Contact Sheet".
- 6. Ensure that district/provincial prosecutors give due weight to social inquiry reports while investigating children's offences and establishing their cases.
- 7. Ensure that district/provincial prosecutors discuss the case with the social worker who prepared the social inquiry report before making a legal decision about the juvenile case.
- 8. In those provinces there are Juvenile Justice Units of the Criminal Investigation Departments (CID), ensure that Juvenile prosecutors are available to consult on Juvenile cases with the police of the Juvenile Justice Units (CID) and their social work colleagues assigned to these units.
- 9. Regularly and systematically compile statistics on all children in contact with the law and also on related actions taken by prosecutors and report these statistics monthly basis to the LoA National Working Group...
- 10. Fully support the implementation of a policy to divert children who have committed first time offences and/or accused of obscenity away from the formal court process, building on Articles 20 and 21 of the Juvenile Code.
- 11. Ensure that the central AGO promotes the use of diversion by district and provincial prosecutors and supports cases where it has been recommended.

MINISTRY OF JUSTICE (MoJ)

The Ministry of Justice (MoJ) shall:

- 1. Appoint a senior level official authorised to represent the MoJ in the LoA National Working Group.
- 2. Instruct MoJ provincial directors to provide the required support in implementing the LoA at provincial level.

- 3 In addition to those persons mentioned in Article 39 of the Law on Juvenile Rehabilitation and Correction Centers, ensure the free and direct access of trained social workers of MoLSAMD and child protection service organisations to the Juvenile Rehabilitation Centers (JRC) for case follow-up and completion of social inquiry reports.
- 4. Ensure that there are adequate funds, resources and numbers of staff allocated to maintain a healthy and safe environment for children in the JRCs in line with international juvenile justice standards. Ensure that JRC staff are trained and have clear job descriptions.
- 5. Provide social workers with all necessary supports so that they can prepare individual care and reintegration plans for children placed in the JRCs. This includes sharing with social workers all information relating to the child available to the JRC:
- 6. Regularly and systematically complie statistics on the children in contact with the law in JRCs and report these on a monthly basis to the LoA National Working Group.
- 7. Provide defense attorneys with all the necessary support including access to records, the social inquiry report and physical access to JRCs in order that they can represent children detained in JRCs to ensure that detention is used as a last resort.
- 8. Ensure that there are adequate programmes and trained male and female staff to promote the rehabilitation and psychological wellbeing of all children detained in JRCs.
- 9. Ensure that there are adequate links with the families and communities of the children detained in JRCs during their detention.
- 10. Ensure that JRCs prepare fully for the reintegration of children into the community before authorizing the release of the child and that children are released to only to approved family members or quardians

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (MoE)

The Ministry of Education (MoE) shall:

- 1. Appoint a senior level official authorised to represent MoE in the LoA National Working Group.
- 2. Instruct MoE provincial directors to provide the required support in implementing the LoA at provincial level.
- 3. Provide trained and qualified male and female teachers to educate the children detained in JRCs to the same standard as in schools in the community. Ensure that these teachers have clear job descriptions and are informed of their duties and curriculum responsibilities. Provide textbooks and teaching materials to the children detained in the JRC to facilitate their education.

- 4. Ensure that teachers within JRCs facilitate the coordination of the reintegration of children from JRCs back into the schools in their communities and that the monitor their attendance for 6 months following release.
- 5. Provide social workers with access to a child's educational and school records in order to write social inquiry reports.
- 6. Provide social workers with all the necessary support and access to enter any school or education facility relating to a child in conflict with the law and provide assistance and facilitate any meetings with staff at the facility.
- 7. Cooperate with any requests for information pertaining to a child's age, degree of psychological development, character and aptitude, educational level and any other information that would be required in order to complete a social inquiry report including any other information that can affect detention and sentence.
- 8. Regularly and systematically compile statistics on the children who have had contact with the law in schools and report these on a monthly basis to the LoA National Working Group.

THE SUPREME COURT (SC)

The Supreme Court (SG) shall:

- 1. Appoint a senior level official authorised to represent SC in the LoA National Working Group.
- 2. Instruct all Judges to provide the required support in implementing the LoA at provincial level
- 3. Ensure that all Judges and members of the Juvenile Court are trained in the Juvenile Code 2005 and the LoA.
- 4. Ensure that Judges only consider juvenile cases that have been referred by the juvenile prosecutor's office.
- Instruct all Judges, when receiving a child's case, to check the file for inclusion of a
 social inquiry report. As with other incomplete files (Article 30, Juvenile Code), those
 missing a social inquiry report should be returned to the respective juvenile prosecutors
 for completion.
- 6. Ensure that Judges give due weight to the recommendations made in the social inquiry reports when making a decision on a case.
- 7. Ensure that no child's case is heard without the presence of their defense attorney.
- 8. Ensure that the social worker who has prepared the social inquiry report is given the opportunity to provide testimony during the court hearing.

- 9 Develop programmes and implementation mechanisms that will enable judges to use alternative sentencing options as per Article 35 of the Juvenile Code 2005.
- 10. Regularly and systematically compile statistics on all children who have their cases heard in all three tiers of the court and report these on a monthly basis to the LoA National Working Group

THE MINISTRY OF PUBLIC HEALTH (MoPH)

The Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) shall

- 1. Appoint a senior level official dully authorized to represent MoPH in the LoA National Working Group.
- 2. Instruct provincial Directors of Health to provide required support in implementation of the LoA at provincial level.
- 3. Provide regular and on-going medical care including medical supplies to children in contact with the law when necessary at arrest stage and in the JRCs.
- 4. Conduct an impartial, non-intrusive and child-sensitive medical assessment of all children on entry to a JRC.
- 5. Conduct a health and hygiene assessment of JRCs on a quarterly basis including an assessment of the physical environment, food and hygiene practices. Assist in ensuring JRCs meet the necessary international standards of health and hygiene for the children.
- 6. Provide health and hygiene assessments of National Directorate of Security detention centers and provide medical care to children detained there.
- 7. Support police, prosecutors and Judges by undertaking timely and impartial age verification of children referred to forensic medicine.
- 8. In the cases the health care centers do not have the facilities for providing free health services, the treatment costs of child shall be paid by JRC or the family of the child, in case of ability.
- 9. Regularly and systematically compile statistics on the children in contact with the law who have received medical check-ups, treatment or age-verification and report these on a monthly basis to the LoA National Working Group.

MINISTRY OF WOMEN'S AFFAIRS (MoWA)

The Ministry of Women's Affairs (MoWA) shall:

- Appoint a senior level official dully authorized to represent MoWA in the LoA National Working Group.
- 2. Instruct provincial Directors of Women's Affairs (DoWA) to provide required support in implementation of the LoA at provincial level.
- 3. Provide suitable shelter accommodation and psychological support to children after release from JRCs in cases where children's families or guardians are unknown or families or guardians refuse to receive their children
- 4. Regularly and systematically compile statistics on female children in contact with the law and report these on a monthly basis to the LoA National Working Group

NATIONAL DIRECTORATE OF SECURITY (NDS)

The National Directorate of Security (NDS) shall

- 1. Appoint a senior level official dully authorized to represent NDS in the LoA National Working Group.
- 2. Instruct provincial NDS Directors to provide required support in implementation of the LoA at a provincial level.
- 3. Guarantee that no child is arrested or detained illegally or arbitrary by NDS.
- 4. Provide lawyers with unfettered and private access to the children in NDS detention.
- Guarantee that all children arrested or detained by the NDS are allowed access a trained social worker listed in the provincial Social Worker Contact Sheet in order to assist them in solving their problems, and their protection and reintegration to their families.
- Guarantee that all children detained in NDS detention centers are treated according to international juvenile justice standards in line with the Convention on the Rights of the Child.

7. General Provisions

- 10.1 This Letter of Agreement is enforceable upon signature of all 9 parties. The parties to the LoA reserve the right to amend the provisions of this LoA by unanimous consent.
- 10.2 By signing this letter the parties hereby confirm their approval, agreement and support to this Letter of Agreement.
- 10.3 This Letter of Agreement is enforceable pursuant to the prior six parties Letter of Agreement and shall continue till the time the parties require.

Sabject Juveniles Medical Services Survey.

Dear All,

Afghan juvenile detention and correction centres are managed by the Juvenile Rehabilitation Department under the Ministry of Justice (MoJ) whereas adult detention facilities are managed by the Central Prison Department (CPD) under the Ministry of Interior (MoI). Historically, the CPD was under the MoI, until 2003 when it was transferred to the MoJ, as that Ministry was seen as a more "neutral" authority. In 2009, the Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) agreed with the MoJ, through a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU), to provide medical personnel to the MoJ prisons, detention centres and JRD needs. When in 2012 the CPD (adult prisoners) was transferred back to the MoI due to MoI being able to provide better security (and LOTFA funding), the JRD remained with the MoJ. However, the MoPH continues to provide health care to JRD's juveniles although juvenile health care does not have a specific budget line allocation. It is believed that the 2009 MOU with MoPH still stands in the case of the JRD.

The Minister of Justice, Abdul Basir Anwar, has during several meetings with UNAMA RoL, expressed a keen interest in the state of JRCs across the country. Once we have inspected and established the state of JRCs and the main recurring problem areas, UNAMA RoL HQ will be in a position to approach the Ministry of Justice (and other concerned Ministries) with a view to resolving the major issues in anticipation of assisting the Government to provide enhanced health care to its juvenile population.

We need each of the RoL teams to make an inspection of each Juvenile Rehabilitation Centre in their region to survey the provision of medical services in line with the questions detailed below.

The deadline for this task will be COB Sunday 1st November 2015.

During the survey, it will be a good idea to speak to not only the JRD staff but also the juveniles themselves – especially with regard to sanitation, food (quantity and quality), access to health care, routine medical inspections, outbreaks of disease, illness and death.

Please note the following domestic legislation -

Article 11, 17, 19 & 20 of the Law on Juvenile Rehabilitation and Correction Centres

Art. 11(4) Ministry of Justice is responsible to adjust the existing buildings of the Juvenile Rehabilitation and Correction Centers with taking into consideration of the Islamic values and UN standards.

Art 17(1) The authorities of the Javenile Rehabilitation and Correction Centers are responsible to furnish/equip the relevant open and closed centers with proper health materials and keep its environment clean and hygiene.

Art. 19(1) The authorities of the Juvenile Rehabilitation and Correction Centers, in cooperation with Ministry of Health, are responsible to provide free health services, to suspected, if accused and confined children.

Art. 19(2) If the sick child mentioned in Item (1) of this Article cannot be treated in the Juvenile Rehabilitation and Correction Centers, the authorities of the correction centers\ shall transfer him/her, recommended by the responsible doctor, to a proper hospital outside the center and inform the relevant Attorney General's Office on their taken action. The authorities of the juvenile correction center are responsible to undertake necessary precautionary measurements, in cooperation with police to ensure the security of the sick child.

- Art. 20 (1) To respect the health regulations and sanitation, the assigned doctor in the Juvenile Rehabilitation and Correction Centers is responsible to control the daily food, check the living rooms and provided services of the suspected, accused and confined children at least twice week.
- (2) The contagious diseases sick patients shall be kept in the special areas, separated from other children...

Annex D

Protocol for the provision of health services between the Ministry of Justice and the Ministry of Public Health dated April 2009

Prisons Health Service Protocol between the Ministry of Justice and the Ministry of Public Health

The Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) has developed a Prisons Health Service Strategy to improve the health of all prisoners, including juveniles and young children who live with their mothers in prisons, through the provision of health services. The health facilities are accessible only by prison staff. [NB This last sentence is taken to mean that the health services are also available to prison staff while they are on duty.]

The health services provided will be basic but comprehensive. The Prisons Health Service Strategy covers the following issues:

- 1. Prevention
- 2. Epidemiological Observations
- 3. Treatment Services
- 4. Professional Health Services
- 5. Control and Treatment of Communicable Diseases (eg TB and HIV)
- 6. Mental Health
- 7. Disability
- 8. Special Issues relating to prisons
- 9. Ante and Post Natal Healthcare
- 10. Child Immunization and Health
- 11. Services for Drug Addicts (Drug Demand and Harm Reduction)
- 12. Supply of Essential Drugs

The Prisons Health Service Strategy will be implemented either by the MoPH or the NGO's to which it has contracted-out the provision of health services. The Strategy, which will be effective from 1st April 2009, will also cover juveniles at the Juvenile Education Centre.

The Prisons Health Service Package describes the level and type of facilities and how the services will be delivered, as well as the required resources infrastructures, drugs, and Human Resources. 23 small/medium-sized prisons will receive a basic health service (BHS) and 11 medium/large prisons will have a comprehensive health

service (CHS). Pol-e-Charkhi will also have a small hospital. The Prisons Health Service Package will be integrated into the MoPH Health Service Package; and it will be funded by the donors who fund the MoPH.

CPD' Health Unit, which also covers Detention Centres relevant to the Ministry of Justice (MoJ), is responsible for monitoring the health service and not for delivering it. In general, health services will be provided by the MoPH or the NGO's it has contracted. CPD's Health Unit will be responsible for monitoring the health service and it will report to CPD's Director General. This Protocol replaces the previous Protocol, which was signed between MoPH and MoJ for the treatment of prisoners in 2006.

MoPH Responsibilities

- Providing health services based on MoPH policy
- Examining all new prisoners and preparing confidential health files on them, identifying whether either they have a chronic disease or one that needs immediate diagnosis and treatment
- Preparing health files for all prisoners who have a serious health condition or who are sentenced to prison for more than one year; these files will only be accessible to the staff of MoJ, MoPH and contracted NGOs
- Supplying furniture, equipment and other necessary items for the health facilities
- Supplying and distributing drugs in accordance with the Prisons Health Service Package
- Hiring professional staff and paying their salaries and allowances
- Contracting NGO's if there is a need for 'contracting-out'
- Monitoring the health services and providing reports to MoPH, MoJ and donors
- Recording prisons health service information in the MoPH's health information system
- Providing copies of all reports to MoPH

MoJ Responsibilities

- Providing/ensuring living conditions for prisoners that reduce health risks
- Taking necessary action to control insects
- Providing food for sick and hospitalised prisoners

- Providing milk for children (apart from those who are being breastfed) who
 are living with their mothers in prisons
- Providing and maintaining health facilities (including the provision of drinking water, hygienic conditions, heat, light and power) as explained in the Prisons Health Service Package
- Providing support to facilitate the examination of all new prisoners
- Responding positively to the advice of medical staff and taking appropriate action (for example, isolation and the provision of special services)
- Providing support to ensure implementation of the National Health
 Programme in prisons (eg relating to mental health, TB, drug demand, harm reduction, and HIV)
- Ensuring security when prisoners are treated or hospitalised outside the prison on the advice of the medical staff
- Ensuring that health facilities are accessible to all prisoners and that security or transportation issues do not constrain the access of sick prisoners to hospitals
- Managing hunger strikes; if there are any health issues, MoPH will take action based on MoJ's instructions
- Supplying additional services and staff, guards, and cleaners (also laundry services in Pol-e-Charkhi)
- Providing security and access for health staff. Ensuring that health facilities
 and other relevant work areas, eg kitchens, are always accessible to MoPH
 and NGO staff and that they are able to visit the health facilities at any time
 (Including in high security prisons)
- Monitoring the health care services and reporting to MoPH, MoJ and donors
- Establishing a joint committee, consisting of MoPH, MoJ and Mol representatives, to deal with any problems in the provision of health care services
- Providing support to the MoPH's National Campaign Programme

Joint Responsibilities of MoJ and MoPH

At the Provincial level, representatives of both Ministries should establish a
Prisons Health Committee for each Province to work as an advisory body on
prison health Issue; following their establishment, a list of members should be
sent to the Prisons Sub-Working Group for Health. [NB Not yet established.]

In the event of any problems relating to health and security issues, they should be solved by the Province's Health Director and the Prison Commander with the support of the relevant Prisons Health Committee.

- If a problem cannot be solved at Provincial level, the issue should be referred to central MoJ and MoPH, and, if necessary, the Prisons Sub-Working Group for Health will work to solve it.
- The MoPH is able to provide these services only if the required budget is available'.
