Floods Update 17 May 2010

The following is an update on the floods situation in Afghanistan since OCHA's last update on 12 May:

Northern region:

The following information has been received on flood response in the North:

Central Highlands:

Bamyan province:

- The DDMC reported new flooding on 11 May in Khamard district that resulted in 11 people injured and an increase in the number of damaged houses in the district from 170 to 277.
- Access roads to Khamard and Saighan districts are still blocked; DoPW/PRT are to open them.
- Secondary access roads from villages to district centers are still blocked in most villages; DoRRD is planning to undertake cash for work programs.

Dai Kundi province:

- No assessment data has been received from Dai Kundi to date; access continues to be difficult due to geography and insecurity.
- IOM has allocated a total of 700 NFI kits and 1200 tarpaulins for the four most affected districts (Sangtakht, Khidir, Shahrstan, and Ashtarlay).

Central region:

- Panjshir province:** According to the PRT, at a meeting with ANDMA it was reported that flooding had affected 93 families in 4 districts, including 14 acres of farmland and two houses damaged. Response from government/UN has been minimal and PRT plans to provide assistance through line ministries; OCHA is following up.
- Parwan province:** an RRD team is conducting an assessment of flood-affected areas; some families are reported to have already been assisted by ARCS and RRD.
